## **Description**

Stature: Size:

Bark: Patchwork of grey, yellow and brownish blotches or horizontal bands with black dots. When cut the bark gives off a \$odeur acidulee. Leaves: Leaves alternate and aggregated at end of shoots. Parapinnate with 11-15 alterrnate leaflets. Rachis often extend beyond the terminal-most leaflet. Wood has a varnish smell.

Flower: in axillary cymes.

Dioecious.

Fruit: large dehiscent capsule (5

compartments).

Seed: light seed with an apycal wing.
